Global Health professionals utilize their analytical, programmatic and evaluation skills to impact the health and wellness of communities around the world by addressing health disparities and inequities at a global scale. Within Global Health, there are a range of career pathways that take professionals to field work, humanitarian crises, supporting country offices from an organizations HQ, and working for large and small organizations. Practitioners primarily find careers in program management, research, consulting, and academia at home and abroad. With little or no Global Health experience, recent graduates often take on assistant or associate roles and the median annual salary for an entry-level Global Health professional is \$55,000. While the national level median annual salary for any Global Health professionals is \$89,250. Salaries of practitioners are highly dependent on location, technical skills, years of experience, language skills, hazard pay, and the type of organization.
