

PROFESSIONAL INTRODUCTION GUIDE

A professional introduction may be used to introduce yourself during networking events such as the Public Health Career Fair, during an interview for an APEX, or full-time opportunity. This guide is to assist you with the development of a professional introduction. Be sure that your introduction:

- ✔ Focuses on education and professional development
- ✓ Can be used to describe work experience and key accomplishments
- ✓ Informs the listener of your current status; what you have to offer
- ✓ Length 30 seconds to max of 2 minutes

1ST DISCUSS WHERE YOU ARE RIGHT NOW:

Thanks so much for speaking with me. My name is (Name). (Referral's name) suggested that I speak with you as someone who might have information about the field of Global Health Epidemiology. In May, I will be graduating from GW's Milken Institute School of Public Health with an MPH in Epidemiology.

2ND DISCUSS RELEVANT EXPERIENCE/SKILLS/INTERESTS GAINED

As a student at the School of Public Health, I was a research assistant in the Global Health department, where I conducted research and analyzed qualitative data on the negative effects of the food industry in China.

I completed my APEX (Practicum) at the CDC, where I collaborated with a team to conduct research and developed a presentation on the commercial determinants of health in developing countries.

During my Global Health Disparities course, my team created a poster presentation on international tobacco use prevention and it was selected to be on display at the ASPH conference last year.

3RD DISCUSS THE GOALS AND OBJECTIVES FOR THE CONVERSATION
