Message from the Senior Associate Dean for Research

Dear Colleagues,

As we witness the devastating effects of war on society in many parts of the world, we observe the consequences of conflict on people's health. Wars and conflict constitute complex health emergencies; they lead to the breakdown of all aspects of a society and cause damage and destruction. They also exacerbate pre-war health issues such as poor health systems or the management of the COVID-19 pandemic. Likewise, vulnerable groups such as women, children, people with disabilities and the elderly are disproportionately affected and are often most in need of help. War also affects health long after the conflict has ended; and armed conflicts do not just cause physical harm, they have considerable mental health consequences.

In war, public health professionals become heroes as they continue to provide care, save lives, and shelter the most vulnerable while risking their own lives. And research on conflicts, disasters, trauma/injuries and humanitarian emergencies is much needed to both understand the implications and test interventions; this is critical for the public health response to intentional conflict. The research portfolio of our school and GW on these topics is laudable, and I am sure it will grow in the coming years - thanks to everyone who works in this space.

Developing Confirmatory HIV Testing and Linkage to Care Intervention Strategies for Men in Tanzania



Dr. Donaldson F. Conserve, MS, PhD We are pleased to highlight Dr. Donaldson Conserve's research project: *Developing Confirmatory HIV Testing and Linkage to Care Intervention Strategies for Men in Tanzania.* The proposed project aims to use Intervention Mapping (IM), which is a multistep theorybased intervention development process (7), to develop the Self-Testing Education and Promotion+ (STEP+) intervention to support confirmatory HIV testing and linkage to care for male partners who self-test and receive a positive result at home. Findings from the Associate Professor Prevention and Community Health The George Washington University Milken Institute School of Public Health proposed study may also inform the development and implementation of interventions for confirmatory HIV testing and linkage to care in other settings, including Washington D.C. where HIVST was rolled out by the DC Department of Health in 2020.
