As a friendly reminder, the National Institutes of Health is requiring use of an updated/new Other Support and Biosketch starting January 25, 2022. In these new changes, applicants are required to provide full transparency and disclosure of all research activities, foreign and domestic in Other Support - which has to include all resources made available to a researcher in support of, and/or related to, all of their research endeavors.

We want to contgratulate Dr. Tamara Henry of PCH who has been awarded CTSI -CN funds to conduct an exploratory pilot study entitled, Black women with Fibroids: lived experience, effects on fertility and decision making.

Black women of childbearing age disproportionately represent the incidence and prevalence of fibroids. Dr. Henry will utilize a qualitative methodology to document the process by which Black women received their diagnosis, learned about treatment options inclusive of effects on fertility, interacted with providers and arrived at their decision.
