

Dr. Catherine Arsenault



Dr. Catherine Arsenault is Assistant Professor in the Department of Global Health at the GWSPH. She holds a PhD in Epidemiology from McGill University and during her postdoctoral fellowship at the Harvard T.H. Chan School of Public Health she was a member of the Lancet

Systems in the sustainable development goals era. Her work focuses on health system quality, health inequalities and on the use of routine health data for improved monitoring. Her research lab uses both existing data from nationally representative household and health facility surveys and primary data collection to inform

She recently completed a Grand Challenges ICODA initiative driver project that addressed the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic on health system resilience in 10 countries. As a member of the QuEST network, she is leading a mobile phone cohort study on maternal and newborn health care quality in Ethiopia, India, Kenya, and South Africa. She is also involved in the evaluation of a routine immunization strengthening program in the Democratic Republic of Congo, Niger, Somalia, and Pakistan. In Fall 2024, she will be teaching a new graduate course on Health System Quality Measurement in Global Health (PUBH 6478).

If you are considering or planning to submit a proposal for extramural funding, please inform Pod 2 by completing an Intent to Submit form as soon as possible. Proposal applications from GWSPH principal investigators to outside funding agencies do require facilitation from Pod 2. A manager from Pod 2 will assign proposal support requests to aid with the application process within 2 business days. The earlier we receive the intent form, the better the quality of service we can provide.

Pod 2 requests at least **10 business days** to process a proposal on top of the 5 business days required by the Office of Sponsored Projects (OSP).


