Redefining Maternal Anemia in Pregnancy and Postpartum Study

We are pleased to highlight Dr. who, in collaboration with Dr. Kwaku Poku Asante at the Kitampo Health Research Centre in Ghana, is the co-principal investigator of the ***Redefining Maternal Anemia in Pregnancy and Postpartum (ReMAPP) study***.

The multicenter, international, population-based cohort study intends to establish and validate new global reference values for maternal hemoglobin. The study will recruit 2,000 pregnant women in Ghana, Pakistan, India, Kenya, and Zambia and will collect detailed data about infection, micronutrient status, environmental exposures, and maternal and infant health and neurodevelopment. Drs. Qing Pan, Lynda Ugwu, and Madeline Rice are also supporting the project as GW co-investigators.
