Research Project Highlight

Dr. Susan Anenberg's research focuses on the health



implications of air pollution and climate change, ranging from local to global scales. She is a Professor and Chair of the Environmental and Occupational Health Department, as well as the Director of the GW Climate and Health Institute and the new NIH-funded Research and Engagement for Action on Climate and Health (REACH) Center. Dr. Anenberg serves on the U.S. EPA's Science Advisory Board, the WHO's Global Air Pollution and Health Technical Advisory Group, and the National Academy of Science's Committee to Advise the U.S. Global Change Research Program. She works together with the Air, Climate, and Health lab at GW to investigate the interrelationships between air quality, climate change, public health, and environmental policy using multi-disciplinary methods. Research in the Air, Climate, and Health lab is currently focused on several projects supported by NIH, NASA, NOAA, and Wellcome Trust. These include: 1) Bridging big

data to climate solutions that advance health and environmental justice. 2) Leveraging satellite NO2 concentrations to estimate surface-level NO2 concentrations, mortality burdens, and inequities in the continental U.S. 3) Evaluating the influence of geostationary space-based atmospheric composition data for assessing air pollutionrelated health impacts. 
