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The Milken Institute School of Public Health (SPH) offers the Minor in Public Health. Through this minor, students are introduced to a wide range of public health topics, such as health epidemiology, health management, health policy, health behavior, environmental and occupational health, global health, and others. The Public Health Minor consists of at least 18 credits (9 credits of required public health courses and 9 credits of public health elective courses). The minor provides a strong foundation in public health in preparation for professional schools including: law school, medical school, physician assistant school, allied health professional school, public health and health services school. Admissions Requirements: 2.75 cumulative GPA or above.

To Add or Drop a Minor and to Change the Original Program of Study

Policies

- 1. Public health minors may only double count <u>1</u> course across their minor and their major(s) or another minor.
- 2. EXNS/PUBH 3995: BSPH minors may only apply 3 credits of Undergraduate Research toward their minor elective requirement and may only take 6 credits total. This course may be taken Pass/Fail with the permission of the instructor.
- 3. Students must earn a C- or higher in all courses required for the minor (core and elective) to graduate with a Public Health minor.
- 4. Due to the high volume of transactions during University registration, applications for the public health minor will be accepted during the academic year except within <u>3 weeks</u> of the beginning of course registration.
